Unknown Sponsor Demonstrates Maanakitanga Among Us

Kia ora koutou, it's that time of year when we reflect and celebrate Matariki and we are reminded that Tui Trust is primarily focused on producing positive social outcomes for children in communities where the educational participation rate is significantly lower than the national average. We also reflect on realisation that the equity in Tui Trust Projects will be more constrained than in a business focused on producing financial returns, as Tui Trust addresses social issues that significantly impact the New Zealand Economy and this maybe be of interest to many socially minded investors.

The Tui Trust Give-A-Little Page was established 10 years ago in June 2011. In 2021 we are grateful to a single sponsor donating to this campaign demonstrating the maanaki among us and the willingness to help the children we support. This single sponsor enabled us to purchase outdoor sports equipment for Moko Club Huntly and is a great example of social minded investment.



We are happy to announce earlier this year we installed soft fall chip at Moko Club Huntly, a project sponsored for two years in a row by The Lion Foundation—the soft fall has

transformed the playground and the children can now play in all weather, all year round. The children, teachers and Huntly Community pass on their gratitude to *The Lion Foundation* team for understanding the needs of our community and backing us.

We must thank Jan Gatley and *D.V. Bryant* for their support with our Winter Warmth Project by providing warm winter Pyjamas and clothing for every child at Moko Club—over 55 children! Quite an achievement (see photos overleaf). Jan also purchased a number of New Zealand native bird finger puppets for storytelling and beautiful books including stories about Matariki and Maui. These resources generated excitement and interest from many children and that is a great outcome for all. Nga mihi Jan.

Website Upgrades and Marketing continue

With a grant from **Trust Waikato** in November 2020 supporting our *Resource Development Projects* we are continually updating and upgrading our website and weeks away to launching our *Shop Page* with a variety of fundraising options. The *Shop Page* will have sponsorship options at different levels of sponsorship for people to choose from. We will also have products for sale including a newly designed gift card series. We continue to explore options for 'mail-chimp' style email communications which is fabulous communication platform, but comes with a hefty on-going price tag, but we are hoping to find a solution enabling multi-use this style of newsletter electronically.

Moko Gym Project, playground softfall for Moko Club

In January 2020 we purchased an amazing 16-piece outdoor playground for the children at Moko Club Huntly, enabling active-learning, improved physical, social, cognitive development. January 2021 we replaced the playground grassed/dirt area into barked soft-fall. This has transformed the playground—it is accessible all year round, in all weather conditions. Thank you to **The Lion Foundation** for supporting us!

SSFI—School Starter Pack Project—5 KitBox

The Starter Pack has everything a child will need to start school, cake, gifts, school fees, stationery and uniform. We have now gifted to 23 children at Moko Clubs! We are grateful to Jane and her team at **SSFI** for partnering with us.

Tamariki Sponsorship

In some circumstances it may not be possible for whānau to access the *free* hours offered through subsidies. Tui Trust sponsor these children to attend Moko Club. We also ensure all children have transportation and can be picked-up and dropped off every day if necessary—this is a free service offered to all children enrolled at Moko Club.



Hamilton Holiday Homes supports our Winter Warmth Project

Tui Trust supports Family Start, a FREE home visiting programme that focuses on improving children's growth and health. **Hamilton Holiday Homes** donated over 100 duvets and warm blankets to us to distribute to Family Start Waikato and Moko Club. Future Developments

Charities SSFI & Tui Trust team up to deliver the 5 KitBox

This project is addressing inequity for children's education from day one of entering school. SSFI (School Start First Impressions) and Tui Trust are child-centric Charities that support the well-being of children in particular the area of early childhood education. The communities we support experience severe and persistent poverty and are more likely to experience poorer educational outcomes, health and more difficulty finding work in adulthood. SSFI and Tui Trust have successfully collaborated over the past 18 months. SSFI has managed growth to service referrals from Tui Trust, providing support to Moko Clubs in the areas of Huntly and Ngāruawāhia. We are now trialing an expansion of our gifting in areas to include the wider communities of Huntly, Ngāruawāhia, Mercer, Taupiri and rural North Waikato.

Maara Kai —Garden to Table Project

Moko Clubs have been developing a *Garden Growing Programme* to incorporate gardens in the home. This is a way to empower whānau to grow their own gardens and subsidise their food bills as well as eat healthy organic food. To support this project Tui Trust is fundraising to offer Moko Club whānau quality macrocarpa planter boxes and everything they need to grow veges; \$450 per whānau. Digital learning at Moko Club

We recently partnered with Vaka Interactiv[®] to produce several digital storytelling experiences for Moko Club. This technology combines the virtues of art, culture and storytelling into an interactive and impactful learning experience. We now wish to utilise this technology to enhance and reinforce the learning experience, in particular literacy by giving children the tools to create their own stories in their own words, paintings and drawings and publish these into e-books and possibly printed. To commence this work we are fundraising \$9,000 for hardware including child-friendly touch-screen tablets; all-in-one high-spec Dell; Adobe software for post-production to collate, digitise and publish distribute the children's stories.

Moko Gym Promoting Hauora Project

Tui Trust aims to deliver our *Moko Gym Promoting Hauora Project* by collaborating with the *Jumping Beans[®] The Physical Activity Programme* specifically designed for the children at Moko Club aged between 2-5 years old. At the time of this publication this programme would involve the children enrolled in the Moko Clubs.

We are currently fundraising and seeking support to implement the well established *Jumping Beans[®] Model* and then examine the influence of a Māori-centric physical activity programme on teachers' knowledge, skills, attitudes and pedagogies towards physical literacy & nutrition within Moko Clubs. In this issue we would like to focus on one of our projects, Maara Kai Garden to table project—we would love to teach, encourage and enable whānau to experience the benefits of growing their own kai.

MAARA KAI - GARDEN TO TABLE PROJECT

This project is an extension to the successful *Gardening Growing Programme* delivered at Moko Club. This project is teaching children the skills they need to grow their own vegetables and a way to empower whānau to grow their own gardens and subsidise their food bills as well as eat healthy organic food.

We would like to provide whānau with either ready-made or flat-pack ready to assemble planter box, similar to the planter boxes pictured above, made from good quality long lasting H4 6x4 treated timber, 150 litres of potting mix and a variety of vegetable seedlings to start their vegetable garden. We will include a booklet of easy to follow gardening information from Yates (a free download). To start off with we would like to trial five boxes



and evaluate outcomes before proceeding with higher production numbers.

PROJECT EXPENSES

The planter boxes pictured above cost \$395.00 (2m x 1m x .45) and are made from Macrocarpa, crafted and designed to last a lifetime (Captain Compost). It is important that the boxes are solid and well-made so they last for many generations. 50 litres of Yates Thrive Premium Potting mix is \$15.76 from Mitre 10 per 50l and we will need 150 litres of potting mix per planter box. Vegetable seedlings vary from \$7-\$21 either from local suppliers.

THE STEPS

Either purchase the planter boxes as outlined previously or contact wood suppliers in Hamilton and ask if they could consider donating good quality long-lasting treated wood (6x4), or Macrocarpa. We are able to cut the wood to size, pre-drill, curved softened edges and ready a flat-pack and provide assembly instructions. The entire planter box will be designed to fit into the back of a station wagon or sedan with seats down and will weigh under 100kg. The idea is to make this as easy as possible for whānau to pick-up, take home and assemble. If whānau are very keen to have a planter box and have no transport we will deliver.

OUTCOMES FOR WHĀNAU and COMMUNITY

We will support each whānau over one or two seasons and keep a visual and/or written diary of their garden experience.

OUTCOMES FOR TAMARIKI—MOKO CLUB BADGE SYSTEM

The children at Moko Club will have the opportunity to earn their Maara Kai Badge. The Moko Club Badges are based on seven values: 1. Kaitiakitanga, Environmental Guardian; 2. Maara Kai, food, gardening; 3. Rangatiratanga, leadership; 4. Toi Māori, visual arts; 5. Tinana, looking after one-self; 6. Whaakari, performing arts; 7. Manaaki, supporting and looking after others. Through curriculum delivery tamariki would demonstrate skills relating to each badge and will be awarded to tamariki in a badge ceremony.
